1. Start Here

Wireless Speaker with Dual Mics for Class, Karaoke & Small Events

Quick Start

1. Power on the speaker and the wireless mic
2. When the mic icon appears on the screen, speak

Before You Use

- Not a professional PA system
- Not a conference system
- Not a USB audio interface

2. Voice Amplification

2.1 How to Use

Before turning on the speaker, set the MIC volume knob to a **low level** to avoid feedback.

- 1 Power on the speaker: hold 
- 2 Power on the mic: hold 
- 3 Wait a few seconds until  appears **solid** on the screen.
- 4 Speak and adjust mic volume.

2.2 Avoid Feedback

- Do not point the mic at the speaker
- Place the speaker **behind** or **to the side** of your body
- Keep at least 1–2 m between mic(s) and speaker
- **Start with low volume**, then increase slowly

3. Bluetooth Music

Use as a Bluetooth speaker:

- ➊ Power on the speaker: hold  →  is blinking. (Ready to pair)
- ➋ On your device, turn on Bluetooth  and select "**VoxAmp Duo**".
Connected:  turns **solid**.
- ➌ Play media on your device.

You'll hear audio through the speaker.

4. Voice + Music

Use voice amplification and Bluetooth music together:

- 1 Connect the mic to the speaker.
(Follow [Voice Amplification](#))
- 2 On your device, turn on Bluetooth and select "**VoxAmp Duo**".
- 3 Play music on your device.
- 4 Speak into the mic.

 Voice and music play **together** through the speaker, with **separate volume controls**.

5. Advanced (Optional)

5.1 Instrument Input

A. How to Use

Use the **6.35 mm (1/4") input** for basic instrument use.

1 Plug your instrument into the 6.35 mm input.

2 Power on the speaker: hold 

The instrument sound plays through the speaker.

5.1 Instrument Input

B. Use Notes

Suitable for:

- Guitar practice
- Simple instrument + vocal use




Not suitable for:

- Multiple instruments
- Professional stage performance

5.2 USB / TF Playback

- 1 Insert a USB drive or TF card
- 2 Power on the speaker: hold  →  /  icon appears **solid**.

Playback will auto-start.

- 3 Press  to control the playback.

Important:

- Not a voice recorder replacement
- Not a USB sound card
- USB is for charging and media playback only

6. What Works (and What Doesn't)

Supported

- Wireless microphones for voice use
- Bluetooth for music playback

Limits

- Bluetooth audio has delay
- DSP processing adds unavoidable latency

Not Supported

- Bluetooth mic
- USB audio to a computer
- Auracast / LE audio
- Large outdoor venues

7. Troubleshooting

No sound from Bluetooth

- Make sure the screen shows **solid** 

Feedback

- Lower volume
- Reposition mic
- Increase distance from speaker

Mic not connecting

- Power the mic off, then on again
- Reduce distance
- Check battery level
